HUMAN DIGNITY AND ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE: ETHICAL APPLICATIONS FOR A FUTURE HARMONY

The technological boom and the social impact that the artificial intelligence has had in recent years has led to a wide range of transformations in the social, political, economic and cultural fields. By leaps and bounds, we increasingly coexist with artificial intelligence, making it part of our personal and professional activities. However, the impact of AI has also been the subject of controversy and analysis. In the workplace, its application seeks to improve efficiency and productivity for the sake of commercial benefit, but replacing thousands of jobs that supports entire families. At the same time, it has entailed a great challenge in Education, where it is a multifaceted tool, but where poor use affects students' learning, inducing plagiarism and cheating. In the biological field it also has its effects. Tasks like spatial memorization, attention, creativity and problem solving are affected by the continuous use of applications with AI that facilitate interaction with the environment. By these algorithms, musical pieces are composed, new works of art and extensive literary texts are created, putting novel dystopias on the table and drawing the growing concern: is it possible that the human being will be replaced by artificial intelligence?









All these elements have motivated different governments to discuss and propose policies to prohibit and mediate its use, something that many technology companies, such as Microsoft, Alphabeth and Open AI, seek to influence to continue developing artificial intelligence. Today billions of dollars are invested for causes that could be aimed to more important human needs, such as health, education, environmental conservation, the elimination of poverty and the culture of peace. Although artificial intelligence is partially used in these areas, if its use and development is not reflected with ethical criteria, having the human being as its goal, the future consequences could be catastrophic, widening the gaps in access to essential resources to maintain the dignity of each individual. Therefore, interdisciplinary analysis that can provide proposals for ethical application that lay the foundations for future harmony between artificial intelligence and human beings are essential, bringing into dialogue the ways in which this phenomenon is seen from different parts of the world and the multiplicity of fields of knowledge, always upholding human dignity.

We therefore invite researchers interested in the theme of domestic violence and the media to submit their articles for this special issue of Trayectorias Humanas Transcontinentales in Word format (in French, English, Spanish or Portuguese) in accordance with the journal's rules, no later than:

TITLE: only the original title should appear + its translation into English (Time New Roman 14)

AUTHOR: First name, Last name, Institution, City, Country, ORCID ID, email (top right/ Time New Roman 12)

ABSTRACTS (no more than 250 words and 5 keywords/ Time New Roman 11)

- a) articles written in French: abstracts in French, Spanish, Portuguese, and English.
- b) articles written in Portuguese: abstracts in Portuguese, French, Spanish and English.
- c) articles written in Spanish: abstracts in Spanish, French, Portuguese, and English.
- d) articles written in English: summaries in English, Spanish, French and Portuguese.

We request that all authors carefully review the abstract in all requested languages.

TEXT BODY: Times New Roman 12

QUOTES OF MORE THAN 2 LINES: Times New Roman 11

FOOTNOTES: Times New Roman 10

NOTE: Changes in style, grammar, and spelling in the various languages, as well as revisions to the journal's standards, are the responsibility of the authors of the articles. Special care should be taken with abstracts in the different languages of the journal.
