Coordinated by Germany's Philipps Universität in Marburg, it brings together 9 institutions from 7 European countries (Germany, France, Spain, Italy, the Czech Republic, Bosnia and Turkey). Aimed at the entire university community (students, teaching staff, researchers and administrative staff), the project will create learning frameworks enhancing Peace, Justice and Inclusive Societies to train a new generation of students promoting tolerance, diversity and pluralism. It will offer opportunities for the co-creation of knowledge and will strengthen the capacity of institutions to directly serve European societies.

Mission

The EUPeace Project funds the creation and development of Research Hubs. The Research Hubs are designed as long-term structures, with the first phase of activities to be completed by October 2027.

Reporting to the University's International Office, you will be responsible for promoting the participation of research and innovation teams from the University of Limoges in the activities of the research networks developed as part of the EUPeace Project and its WP6.

Working closely with the EUPeace teams at the University of Limoges, as well as its Research Department, you will facilitate the creation of synergies between the activities of the research networks and represent the University in exchanges between partners in the EUPeace Alliance concerning these networks. You will play an active role in promoting these networks to strategic external players.

YOUR MAIN ACTIVITIES :

- ➔ **Promote the active participation of UNILIM research teams in EUPeace research networks**, in close collaboration with the Research Department and the EUPeace Project Coordinator. In particular, this will involve raising awareness among research teams of the challenges and opportunities of these

networks; acting as the interface between UNILIM research teams and EUPeace Alliance partners, organising monitoring of collaboration opportunities; promoting the positioning of UNILIM interdisciplinary research areas and teams of excellence.

- ➔ **Represent the University at EUPeace meetings and events on research networks.** Participate in and contribute to all Alliance meetings and exchanges linked to the creation, implementation and development of research networks; promote synergies between the various network activities and between the networks themselves; support the participation of UNILIM teams involved in EUPeace research network events and activities; represent them where appropriate.
- ➔ **Steer the implementation of networks and related activities within UNILIM:** supporting the preparation of proposals for networks led by UNILIM teams, as well as proposals for collaboration with pre-existing networks; assisting the teams involved in the implementation of activities (interdisciplinary seminars; annual research impact conferences, etc.); supporting them in the activities resulting from the EUPeace networks (innovative teaching methods based on research; creative spaces; fellowships; young researchers' network; doctoral network; etc.); and promoting research-mobility opportunities within the EUPeace Alliance while supporting the beneficiaries.
- ➔ **Participate in disseminating the results of EUPeace research networks:** promoting the activities of EUPeace research networks and their results within the University, its ecosystem and with strategic national and international players; participate in setting up a strategic watch on collaborative research opportunities arising from EUPeace research networks.
